A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE COUNTY CONVEYANCE OF SURPLUS
2 AUTOMOBILES TO A NOT-FOR-PROFIT RECIPIENT FOR SUBSEQUENT
3 CONVEYANCE TO WORK FIRST PARTICIPANTS.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. G.S. 160A-279(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) Whenever a city or county is authorized to appropriate funds to any public or
8 private entity which carries out a public purpose, the city or county may, in lieu of or in
9 addition to the appropriation of funds, convey by private sale to such an entity any real or
10 personal property which it owns; provided no property acquired by the exercise of
11 eminent domain may be conveyed under this section; provided that no such conveyance
12 may be made to a for-profit corporation. The city or county shall attach to any such
13 conveyance covenants or conditions which assure that the property will be put to a public
14 use by the recipient entity. The procedural provisions of G.S. 160A-267 shall apply.
15 Provided, however, that a city or county may convey surplus automobiles, without
16 compensation, and without imposing covenants or conditions which assure that the
17 recipient entity itself use the automobiles for a public purpose, to any public or private

- 1 entity that it is authorized to appropriate funds to, for subsequent conveyance by said
2 entity to Work First participants selected by the county department of social services."
3 Section 2. This act applies to Mecklenburg County only.
4 Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
