A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE VARIOUS
SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 20-63(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Every license plate must display the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which it is issued, the name of the State of North Carolina, which may be abbreviated, and the year number for which it is issued or the date of expiration. A plate issued for a commercial vehicle, as defined in G.S. 20-4.2(1), and weighing 26,001 pounds or more, must bear the word "commercial," unless the plate is a special registration plate authorized in G.S. 20-79.4 or the commercial vehicle is a trailer or is licensed for 6,000 pounds or less. The plate issued for vehicles licensed for 7,000 pounds through 26,000 pounds must bear the word "weighted," unless the plate is a special registration plate authorized in G.S. 20-79.4.

Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a registration plate issued by the Division for a private passenger vehicle or for a private hauler vehicle licensed for 6,000 pounds or less shall be a "First in Flight" plate. A "First in Flight" plate shall have the words "First in Flight" printed at the top of the plate above all other letters and numerals. The background of the plate shall depict the Wright Brothers biplane flying over Kitty Hawk Beach, with the plane flying slightly upward and to the right. The following special registration plates do not have to be a "First in Flight" plate. The design of the plates that are not "First in Flight" plates must be approved by the Division and the State Highway Patrol for clarity and ease of identification.

- 43 Enforcement Officers Motorcycle Club, Inc. The plate shall bear the emblem
- 44 of the Blue Knights International Law Enforcement Officers Motorcycle
- 45 Club, Inc. The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the plate
- 46 before this plate may be developed. A person may obtain a special
- 47 registration plate under this subdivision for a motor vehicle or motorcycle
- 48 registered in that person's name. The registration fees and the restrictions on
- 49 the issuance of a specialized registration plate for a motorcycle are the same
- 50 as for any motor vehicle.

50 shall bear the phrase "Mayor" and the letter "M" followed by a number that
51 indicates the municipality the mayor serves. The number of a municipality

2 that assigns number one to the first municipality in the list, except that
3 municipalities incorporated with an effective date after July 1, 2009, shall be
4 placed at the end of the list in order of date of incorporation. The Division
5 may not issue the plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at
6 least 300 applications for the plate.

18 members of the same municipality. The number of a municipality shall be
19 the order of the municipality in an alphabetical list of municipalities that

22 placed at the end of the list in order of date of incorporation. The Division
23 may not issue the plate authorized by this subdivision unless it receives at
24 least 300 applications for the plate.

 () United States Service Academy. – Issuable to a graduate of one of the service academies, who can provide documentation of graduation, in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate shall bear the name of the specific service academy with an emblem that designates the specific service academy being represented.

 () Victory Junction Gang Camp. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle. The plate may bear the phrase "Victory Junction Gang Camp." The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the plate before it may be developed.

SECTION 3. G.S. 20-79.7(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Fees. – Upon request, the Division shall provide and issue free of charge a single Legion of Valor, 100% Disabled Veteran, and Ex-Prisoner of War registration plate to a recipient of a Legion of Valor award, a 100% disabled veteran, and an ex-prisoner of war each year. The preceding special registration plates are subject to the regular motor vehicle registration fees in G.S. 20-88, if the registered weight of the vehicle is greater than 6,000 pounds. All other special registration plates are subject to the regular motor vehicle registration fee in G.S. 20-87 or G.S. 20-88 plus an additional fee in the following amount:

9 Purpose-Pediatric Unit Fund to provide funding for Brenner Children's Hospital.

10 (b75) Choose Life. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a "Choose
11 Life" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money
12 in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Choose Life"
13 plates to the Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship, which shall distribute the money annually to
14 nongovernmental, not-for-profit agencies that provide pregnancy services that are limited to
15 counseling and/or meeting the physical needs of pregnant women. Funds received pursuant to
16 this section shall not be distributed to any agency, organization, business, or other entity that

28 plates to Donate Life North Carolina to be divided equally among the transplant centers in
29 North Carolina to include Bowman Gray Medical Center, Carolinas Medical Center, Duke
30 University, East Carolina University, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. The
31 transplant centers shall use all of the proceeds received from this plate to provide funding for
32 expenses incurred by needy families, recipients, and expenses related to organ donation.

42 Inc., to be used to fund trail projects and related administrative and operating expenses.

43 (b80) NC Civil War. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "NC
44 Civil War" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer quarterly the
45 money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "NC
46 Civil War" plates to the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources, Division of
47 Archives and History, to provide funding to acquire, interpret, and preserve North Carolina's
48 Civil War history.

49 (b81) NC Veterinary Medical Association. – The Division must receive 300 or more
50 applications for the "NC Veterinary Medical Association" plate before the plate may be
51 developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural

1 Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "NC Veterinary Medical Association" plates
2 to the Friends of NCVMA Foundation, Inc., to be used to provide compassionate, quality health
3 care for all animals, to protect the health of the public, to strengthen the human-animal bond,
4 and to provide advanced continuing education for the public.

5 (b82) NC Victim Assistance Network. – The Division must receive 300 or more
6 applications for a "NC Victim Assistance Network" plate before the plate may be developed.
7 The Division must transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate
8 Account derived from the sale of "NC Victim Assistance Network" plates to the NC Victim
9 Assistance Network to support the mission of the NC Victim Assistance Network to provide

36 North Carolina to be used to provide scholarship funding at the 16 constituent universities of
37 The University of North Carolina.

38 (b87) Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for
39 the "Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall
40 transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived
41 from the sale of "Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity" plates to the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., to
42 provide funding for scholarships, education and professional development, or similar programs.
43 None of the proceeds from this special plate may be distributed to any board member as
44 compensation or as an honorarium.

45 (b88) Travel and Tourism. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
46 "Travel and Tourism" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
47 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
48 sale of "Travel and Tourism" plates to the Division of Tourism, Film, and Sports Development
49 to be used for programs in support of travel and tourism in North Carolina.

50 (b89) Home of American Golf. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for
51 the "Home of American Golf" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must

1 transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived
2 from the sale of "Home of American Golf" plates to the Given Memorial Library, Inc., to
3 provide funding for the Given Memorial Library – The Tufts Archives.

4 (b90) Carolinas Golf Association. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications
5 for the "Carolinas Golf Association" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division
6 shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account
7 derived from the sale of "Carolinas Golf Association" plates to the Carolinas Golf Association
8 to be used to promote amateur golf in North Carolina.

9 (b91) NC Horse Council. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
10 "NC Horse Council" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
11 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
12 sale of "NC Horse Council" plates to the North Carolina Horse Council, Inc., to promote and
13 enhance the equine industry in North Carolina.

14 (b92) Support Soccer. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
15 "Support Soccer" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly
16 the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of
17 "Support Soccer" plates to the North Carolina Soccer Hall of Fame, Inc., to provide funding to
18 promote the sport of soccer in North Carolina.

19 (b93) Jaycees. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "Jaycees"
20 plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the
21 Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Jaycees" plates to
22 the North Carolina JCI Senate, Inc., to be used to support and underwrite Jaycee activities in
23 North Carolina.

24 (b94) First in Turf. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "First in
25 Turf" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money
26 in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "First in Turf"
27 plates to the Center for Environmental Turfgrass Research at North Carolina State University
28 for its programs.

29 (b95) Boy Scouts of America. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for
30 the "Boy Scouts of America" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall
31 transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived
32 from the sale of "Boy Scouts of America" plates to the Old Hickory Council of the Boy Scouts
33 of America, where the proceeds will be divided equally among the Boy Scouts of America
34 Councils in this State to be used for educational programs, preservation programs, capital
35 improvements on facilities located in this State, and related administrative and operating
36 expenses.

37 (b96) Girl Scouts. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "Girl
38 Scouts" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the
39 money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Girl
40 Scouts" plates to the Girl Scouts North Carolina Coastal Pines, where the proceeds will be
41 divided equally among the officially chartered Girl Scout Councils in this State to be used for
42 educational programs, preservation programs, capital improvements on facilities located in this
43 State, and related administrative and operating expenses.

44 (b97) S.T.A.R. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "S.T.A.R."
45 plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the
46 Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "S.T.A.R." plates to
47 Save the Animals Rescue, Inc., to provide funding to rescue distressed horses.

48 (b98) P.E.O. Sisterhood. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
49 "P.E.O. Sisterhood" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
50 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the

1 sale of "P.E.O. Sisterhood" plates to P.E.O. International to be used for scholarships for young
2 women.

3 (b99) Piedmont Airlines. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a
4 "Piedmont Airlines" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer
5 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
6 sale of "Piedmont Airlines" plates to Piedmont Silver Eagles Charitable Funds, Inc., to be used
7 for scholarships and family assistance for Piedmont Airlines employees and their families,
8 including surviving spouses and dependents, suffering economic hardship.

9 (b100) North Carolina Emergency Management Association. – The Division must receive
10 300 or more applications for the "North Carolina Emergency Management Association" plate
11 before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the
12 Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "North Carolina
13 Emergency Management Association" plates to the North Carolina Emergency Management
14 Association to be used for training and education purposes.

15 (b101) United States Service Academy. – The Division, with the cooperation of each
16 service academy, shall develop a special plate for each of the service academies. The Division
17 must receive a combined total of 300 or more applications for all the plates authorized by this
18 section before a specific service academy plate may be developed. Only graduates of the
19 service academies may receive a special plate upon furnishing the Division proof of graduation.
20 The Division must transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate
21 Account derived from the sale of "United States Service Academy" plates to NC Support Our
22 Troops, Inc., to be used to provide support and assistance to the troops and their families.

23 (b102) Carolina Raptor Center. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a
24 "Carolina Raptor Center" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer
25 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
26 sale of "Carolina Raptor Center" plates to the Carolina Raptor Center to be used for educational
27 materials, preservation programs, capital improvements for the Carolina Raptor Center, and
28 operating expenses of the Carolina Raptor Center.

29 (b103) NC Beekeepers. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "NC
30 Beekeepers" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the
31 money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "NC
32 Beekeepers" plates to North Carolina State University for research on the importance of bees to
33 agriculture and the State's agricultural economy.

34 (b104) NC Fisheries Association. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for
35 a "NC Fisheries Association" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must
36 transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived
37 from the sale of "NC Fisheries Association" plates to the NC Fisheries Association to facilitate
38 the promotion of North Carolina families, heritage, and seafood through accessible data about
39 the ever-changing commercial fishing industry.

40 (b105) American Red Cross. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for an
41 "American Red Cross" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer
42 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
43 sale of "American Red Cross" plates to the Triangle Area Chapter of the American Red Cross
44 to be used to fund disaster relief, health and safety services, blood services, services to military
45 families, capital improvements on facilities located within the State, and related administrative
46 and operating costs.

47 (b106) Outer Banks Preservation Association. – The Division must receive 300 or more
48 applications for an "Outer Banks Preservation Association" plate before the plate may be
49 developed. The Division must transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural
50 Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Outer Banks Preservation Association"

1 plates to the Outer Banks Preservation Association to facilitate the protection of the public's
2 right to access beaches in North Carolina.

3 (b107) Pamlico-Tar River Foundation. – The Division must receive 300 or more
4 applications for the "Pamlico-Tar River Foundation" plate before the plate may be developed.
5 The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate
6 Account derived from the sale of "Pamlico-Tar River Foundation" plates to the Pamlico-Tar
7 River Foundation, Inc., to provide funding for the cleanup, preservation, and oversight of the
8 Pamlico and Tar Rivers, and their watersheds and basins.

9 (b108) Carolina Regional Volleyball Association. – The Division must receive 300 or more
10 applications for the "Carolina Regional Volleyball Association" plate before the plate may be
11 developed. The Division must transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural
12 Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of the "Carolina Regional Volleyball
13 Association" plates to the Carolina Regional Volleyball Association to promote and develop the
14 sport of volleyball throughout North Carolina.

15 (b109) NC Mining. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the "NC
16 Mining" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must transfer quarterly the
17 money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "NC
18 Mining" plates to the North Carolina Gold Foundation, Inc., to provide funding for information
19 and education about mining in North Carolina.

20 (b110) Battleship North Carolina. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for
21 the "Battleship North Carolina" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division must
22 transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived
23 from the sale of "Battleship North Carolina" plates to the U.S.S. North Carolina Battleship
24 Commission to provide funding for information and education about the role of the Battleship
25 U.S.S. North Carolina in history and for administrative and operating costs of the U.S.S. North
26 Carolina Battleship Commission.

27 (b111) Coastal Land Trust. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
28 "Coastal Land Trust" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
29 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
30 sale of the "Coastal Land Trust" plates to the North Carolina Coastal Land Trust to be used to
31 acquire open space and natural areas, to ensure conservation education, to promote good land
32 stewardship, to set aside lands for conservation, and for other administrative and operating
33 costs.

34 (b112) Toastmasters Club. – The Division must receive 300 or more applications for the
35 "Toastmasters Club" plate before the plate may be developed. The Division shall transfer
36 quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction Plate Account derived from the
37 sale of the "Toastmasters Club" plates to Toastmasters International to be used to help North
38 Carolinians communicate more effectively, improve presentation skills, and develop leadership
39 potential.

40 (b113) Carolinas Credit Union Foundation. – The Division must receive 300 or more
41 applications for the "Carolinas Credit Union Foundation" plate before the plate may be
42 developed. The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural
43 Attraction Plate Account derived from the sale of "Carolinas Credit Union Foundation" plates
44 to the Carolinas Credit Union Foundation, Inc., for youth-focused programs."

45 **SECTION 6.** Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
46 section to read:

47 **"§ 20-79.8. Expiration of special registration plate authorization.**

48 (a) Expiration. – A special registration plate authorized pursuant to G.S. 20-79.4 shall
49 expire, as a matter of law, on July 1 of the second calendar year following the year in which the
50 special plate was authorized if the number of required applications for the authorized special

1 plate has not been received by the Division. The Division shall not accept applications for nor
2 advertise any special registration plate that has expired pursuant to this section.

3 (b) Notification. – The Division shall notify the Revisor of Statutes in writing, not later
4 than July 15 of each year, which special registration plate authorizations have expired as a
5 matter of law pursuant to subsection (a) of this section. The Division shall publish a copy of the
6 written notification sent to the Revisor of Statutes pursuant to this subsection on a web site
7 maintained by the Division or the Department of Transportation.

8 (c) Revisor of Statutes Responsibilities. – Upon notification of expiration of the
9 authorization for any special registration plate by the Division pursuant to this section, the
10 Revisor of Statutes shall verify that the authorization for each special registration plate listed
11 has expired and shall notate such expiration in the applicable statutes. If an authorization for a
12 special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of Statutes shall revise the
13 subdivision referring to the special registration plate to leave the name of the special
14 registration plate authorized and the date the special registration plate's authorization expired. If
15 an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
16 Statutes shall also make corresponding changes to reflect the expiration of the special
17 registration plate's authorization, if applicable, in G.S. 20-63(b), 20-79.7, and 20-81.12."

18 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding Section 6 of this act, any special registration plate
19 authorized in G.S. 20-79.7, prior to July 1, 2011, shall expire, as a matter of law, on July 1,
20 2013, if the number of applications required for the production of the special registration plate
21 has not been received by the Division of Motor Vehicles on or before that date. Upon
22 notification of expiration of the authorization for any special plate by the Division pursuant to
23 this section, the Revisor of Statutes shall verify that the authorization for each special
24 registration plate listed has expired and shall notate such expiration in the applicable statutes. If
25 an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
26 Statutes shall revise the subdivision referring to the special registration plate to leave the name
27 of the special plate authorized and the date the special registration plate's authorization expired.
28 If an authorization for a special registration plate listed in G.S. 20-79.4 expires, the Revisor of
29 Statutes shall also make corresponding changes to reflect the expiration of the special
30 registration plate's authorization, if applicable, in G.S. 20-63(b), 20-79.7, and 20-81.12.

31 **SECTION 8.** The Revisor of Statutes is authorized to alphabetize, number and
32 renumber the special registration plates listed in G.S. 20-79.4 to ensure that all the special
33 registration plates are listed in alphabetical order and numbered accordingly.

34 **SECTION 9.** Section 6 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2011. The remainder
35 of this act is effective when it becomes law.
