SECTION 1.(c) G.S. 18B-1002(d) reads as rewritten:

Administrative Procedure. – A permit issued pursuant to this section shall not be issued less than 10 days before any qualifying event described in subdivisions (1) through (5) of subsection (a) of this section. The Commission shall notify the ALE Section not more than three business days after the date a permit is issued pursuant to this section of the name and address of the applicant, the address of the event, and any conditions placed on the permit pursuant to subsection (c) of this section. Denial or revocation of a permit under this section shall not entitle the applicant or permittee to a hearing under Chapter 150B."

SECTION 2.(b) The Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall submit for approval the emissions inspection program changes provided in subsection (a) of this section to the United States Environmental Protection Agency as an amendment to the North Carolina State Implementation Plan under the federal Clean Air Act. If the United States Environmental Protection Agency approves the amendment, the Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall certify this approval to the Revisor of Statutes. In the certification, the Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources shall include the session law number of this act.

SECTION 2.(c) After the Motor Vehicle Inspection and Law Enforcement System (MILES) is retired and the replacement system for MILES is operational, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall certify to the Revisor of Statutes that MILES has been replaced. "§ 20-196.3. Who may hold supervisory positions over sworn members of the Patrol.

Notwithstanding any other provision of the General Statutes of North Carolina, it shall be unlawful for any person other than the Governor and Governor, the Secretary of Public Safety and other than Safety, the Chief Operating Officer of the Department of Public Safety, or a

uniformed member of the North Carolina State Highway Patrol who has met all requirements for employment within the Patrol, including but not limited to completion of the basic Patrol school, to hold any supervisory position over sworn members of the Patrol."

SECTION 4. G.S. 143-341(8)i.3. reads as rewritten:

3. To require on a schedule determined by the Department all State agencies to transfer ownership, custody or control of any or all passenger motor vehicles within the ownership, custody or control of that agency to the Department, except those motor vehicles under the ownership, custody or control of the Highway Patrol, the State Bureau of Investigation, or the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina which are used primarily for law-enforcement purposes, and except those motor vehicles under the ownership, custody or control of the Department of Public Safety for Butner Public Safety which are used primarily for law-enforcement, fire, or emergency purposes.fire, emergency services, and buses and passenger vans used for inmate and juvenile transportation."

SECTION 5. Section 1(a), 1(b), and 1(c) of this act become effective August 1, 2012, and apply to ABC permits issued on or after that date. Except as otherwise provided, the remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
