(3)	A Class E felony if the offense is a first or second offense and the val	ue of the
	mail is two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or more.	
<u>(4</u>)	A Class D felony if the offense is a third or subsequent offense or if	the value
	of the mail exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000)."	
SI	ECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2025, and applies to	offenses

committed on or after that date.
