10	(b) Any employer who provides compensated or uncompensated job protected sick leave
11	for employees shall permit an employee to use, in any calendar year, the employee's accrued and
12	available sick leave entitlement to attend to the care of a family member for no more than five
13	consecutive days. All conditions and restrictions placed by the employer upon the use by an
14	employee of sick leave also shall apply to the use by an employee of sick leave to attend to the
15	care of a family member.
16	(c) This section does not extend the maximum period of leave to which an employee is
17	entitled under the federal Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (29 U.S.C. § 2606, et seq.),
18 19	regardless of whether the employee receives sick leave compensation during that leave.
20	(d) This section does not apply to any of the following:  (1) Any benefit provided under an employee welfare benefit plan subject to the
21	federal Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (Public Law
22	93-406, as amended).
23	(2) Any insurance benefit, workers' compensation benefit, unemployment
24	compensation disability benefit, or other benefit not payable from the
25	employer's general assets.
26	(e) The rights and remedies specified in this section are cumulative and nonexclusive and
27	are in addition to any other rights or remedies afforded by contract or under other provisions of
28	law."
29	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 95-241(a)(1) reads as rewritten:
30	"(a) No person shall discriminate or take any retaliatory action against an employee
31	because the employee in good faith does or threatens to do any of the following:
32	(1) File a claim or complaint, initiate any inquiry, investigation, inspection,
33	proceeding or other action, or testify or provide information to any person
34	with respect to any of the following:

36	b. Article 2A or Article 16 of this Chapter.
