A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE LAWS REGULATING GAMING DO NOT APPLY TO CERTAIN SOCIAL GAMES PLAYED IN A PRIVATE RESIDENCE, HOME, OR COMMUNITY CLUBHOUSE.		
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Part 1 of Article 37 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended		
by adding a new section to read:		
"§ 14-309.4. Certain social games not unlawful under certain circumstances.		
Notwithstanding any provision of this Article to the contrary, it is not unlawful for persons		
to gather for the purpose of engaging in board games or games of tiles, cards, or dice, including		
canasta, mahjong, and bridge, where the games are played in a private residence, home, or		
community clubhouse or similar structure, and all of the following requirements are met:
