1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR VARIOUS PUBLIC PURPOSES IN HALIFAX, 3 NORTHAMPTON, AND WARREN COUNTIES. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5

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PART I. HALIFAX COUNTY PUBLIC PROJECTS

SECTION 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of State Budget and Management the sum of one hundred fifteen million two hundred eleven thousand seven hundred sixty-three dollars (\$115,211,763) in nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to provide the following directed grants to the following entities:

- Six hundred ten thousand nine hundred forty-four dollars (\$610,944) to the (1) City of Roanoke Rapids for Chaloner Bridge replacement and drainage improvements.
- (2) Forty-five million two hundred eighty thousand eight hundred nineteen dollars (\$45,280,819) to the Roanoke Rapids Sanitary District to be allocated as follows:
 - Four million eight hundred forty-seven thousand eight hundred a. nineteen dollars (\$4,847,819) for the Belmont Pump Station.
 - Six million two hundred eighteen thousand dollars (\$6,218,000) for b. the Premier Boulevard water/sewer extension.
 - Thirty-one million one hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$31,115,000) c. for a drinking water emerging construction project.
 - Three million one hundred thousand dollars (\$3,100,000) for an d. activated sludge blower system.
- Eight million dollars (\$8,000,000) to the Town of Enfield for its electric grid (3) replacement.
- Sixty-one million three hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$61,320,000) to (4) Halifax County to be allocated as follows:
 - Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for sewer line extension to Exit 154 a. on I-95.
 - Three hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$320,000) for Airboss access b.
 - Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for court services building c. renovation.
 - Fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000) for a new county detention center. d.



1 One million dollars (\$1,000,000) for broadband service expansion. 2 SECTION 1.(b) There is appropriated to the Office of State Budget and 3 Management the sum of four million six hundred fifty thousand one hundred seventy-six dollars 4 (\$4,650,176) in nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to provide the following 5 directed grants: 6 Five hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$550,000) to Halifax County to be (1) 7 allocated as follows: 8 Three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) for a new ambulance. a. 9 Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for 18 self-contained b. breathing apparatus for the Darlington Volunteer Fire Department. 10 11 (2) Seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) to Halifax Fire and Rescue, Inc., to purchase a fire truck. 12 13 One hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to the Town of Enfield to upfit (3) fitness building and purchase apparatus for the Fire Department. 14 Fifteen thousand one hundred seventy-six dollars (\$15,176) to the Town of 15 (4) Scotland Neck to purchase body cameras and other needed equipment for the 16 17 Police Department. Two million two hundred ten thousand dollars (\$2,210,000) to the Town of 18 (5) 19 Roanoke Rapids for needs of its fire department, including a new ladder truck, 20 generator, and air packs. 21 One million twenty-five thousand dollars (\$1,025,000) to the Town of Weldon (6) 22 to be allocated as follows: 23 Eight hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$850,000) for a new fire engine. a. 24 b. One hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) for building 25 renovation and site preparation and a viper radio system purchase. 26 27 PART II. NORTHAMPTON COUNTY PUBLIC PROJECTS 28 **SECTION 2.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of State 29 Budget and Management the sum of thirteen million fifty thousand dollars (\$13,050,000) in 30 nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to provide directed grants to the following 31 entities: 32 Four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to the Town of Rich Square for (1) 33 wastewater treatment improvements. 34 Seven million dollars (\$7,000,000) to the Town of Garysburg for water system (2) 35 improvements. 36 Two million one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$2,150,000) to the Town of (3) 37 Seaboard to be allocated as follows: 38 Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for Community Center a. 39 renovation. 40 b. One million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,250,000) for street replacement and repairs. 41 42 Four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for renovation of the Old c. 43 Seaboard Bank. Two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to the Town of Woodland for the 44 (4) 45 construction of a new town hall. 46 (5) One million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) to Northampton

County for wastewater treatment expansion. SECTION 2.(b) There is appropriated to the Office of State Budget and Management the sum of four million seven hundred fifty-six thousand dollars (\$4,756,000) in

nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to provide the following directed grants:

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- Three million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$3,750,000) for
- Four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for water system rehabilitation. c.

SECTION 3.(b) There is appropriated to the Office of State Budget and Management the sum of nine million six hundred six thousand nine hundred twenty dollars (\$9,606,920) in nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to provide the following directed grants:

- (1) Five million two hundred seventy-seven thousand dollars (\$5,277,000) to Warren County to be allocated as follows:
 - One million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) for the needs a. of the Churchill-Five Forks Fire Department, including replacement of fire engines, brush truck, rescue boat, and fire radios and purchase of self-contained breathing apparatus equipment, rescue boat upgrade or replacement, and mobile fire radio replacement.
 - One hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) to purchase a b. brush truck for the Inez Volunteer Fire Department.

Five hundred ninety-two thousand dollars (\$592,000) for the needs of 1 c. 2 the Roanoke-Wildwood Volunteer Fire Department, including 3 self-contained breathing apparatus, boat motor, and water building. 4 One million four hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$1,475,000) d. 5 for the needs of the Hawtree Volunteer Fire Department, including a 6 new fire truck, mortgage settlement, and self-contained breathing 7 apparatus. 8 Two hundred twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$228,000) for the needs e. 9 of the Arcola Rural Volunteer Fire Department, including chief 10 support vehicle, storage facility, new cascade system, uniforms, floor 11 buffer, and a shipping container for training. One hundred fifty-seven thousand dollars (\$157,000) for the needs of 12 f. 13 the Drewry Fire Department, including repairs to parking lot and 14 driveway and purchase of alarm system and garage door operators. Eight hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$850,000) for the needs of the 15 g. Soul City Volunteer Fire Department, including replacement of fire 16 17 engine and first responder vehicle. Three hundred twenty-nine thousand nine hundred twenty dollars (\$329,920) 18 (2) 19 to the Town of Warrenton to be allocated as follows: 20 Thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to purchase body cameras for a. 21 the Police Department. 22 Two hundred ninety-four thousand nine hundred twenty dollars b. 23 (\$294,920) to the Town of Warrenton for the needs of the Rural 24 Volunteer Fire Department, including self-contained breathing 25 apparatus, inflatable raft/boat, and HVAC and equipment upgrades. 26 (3) Four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to the Town of Norlina for a new fire 27 station. 28 29

PART IV. LAKE GASTON

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SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of State Budget and Management the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) in recurring funds for each year of the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium to be used for a multiyear project to treat lyngbya spp., a cyanobacteria, in Lake Gaston.

PART V. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2025.
