Up to four percent (4%) of the funds appropriated to the Community Colleges System 18 (b) 19 Office for implementation of the Program in each fiscal year may be used for administrative 20 costs. 21 (c) Up to ten percent (10%) of the funds appropriated to the Community Colleges System 22 Office for implementation of the Program in each fiscal year may be used for marketing and 23 communications, including contracting with non-State entities for marketing and 24 communications. 25 "§ 115D-160. Grant amounts. 26 To the extent funds are made available for the Program, the State Board of 27 Community Colleges shall award grants to participating community colleges in an amount up to 28 the lesser of (i) the actual cost associated with an application by a community college or (ii) two 29 hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000). 30 (b) In the event that the funds appropriated for the Program are insufficient to award all approved grant awards, each award shall be reduced by an equivalent percentage to ensure that 31 32 funding is awarded to all participating community colleges. 33 "§ 115D-165. Reporting requirement. 34 The State Board, in collaboration with the Department of Commerce, shall analyze data 35 pertaining to the Program and shall report annually by July 15 to the Joint Legislative Education 36 Oversight Committee on the following information from the prior academic year: 37 The total dollar amount of grant funds awarded. (1) 38 **(2)** The total number of participating community colleges. 39 (3) The progress of each local and regional partnership that partnered with a 40 participating community college, as reflected in high school graduation rates, 41 postsecondary enrollment and completion, job growth, and labor market 42 alignment, with data being disaggregated by income, race, ethnicity, and other demographic characteristics, where available." 43 44 SECTION 2.(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 115D-160, as enacted by this act, for the 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 fiscal years, the State Board of Community Colleges shall allocate a 45 total of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to be directed to participating community colleges in 46 47 the following areas affected by Hurricane Helene: 48 Alexander County. SECTION 2.(b) In the event that the total amount of grant awards for the 2025-2026 or 2026-2027 fiscal year to participating community colleges in areas listed in subsection (a) of this section is less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000), the State Board may use those funds to award grants to participating community colleges that are not located in those areas.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community Colleges System Office the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2025.
