Supervisor duty to report; intimidation of school employee. 40 When a supervisor of a school employee has actual notice that the school employee 41 42

- has been the victim of an assault by a student in violation of G.S. 14-33(c)(6)14-33(c2) resulting in physical injury, as that term is defined in G.S. 14-34.7, the supervisor shall immediately report to the principal the assault against the school employee. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "supervisor of a school employee" does not include the principal or superintendent.
- A principal, superintendent, or supervisor of a school employee shall not, by threats or in any other manner, intimidate or attempt to intimidate that school employee from reporting to law enforcement an assault by a student under G.S. 14-33(c)(6):14-33(c2). ...."

**SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2025, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
