A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT REDIRECTING FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, FOR CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTERS TO INSTEAD BE USED TO SUPPORT THE EXPANSION OF EVIDENCE-BASED MATERNAL AND INFANT HEALTH PROGRAMS; REQUIRING THE STATE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF CAROLINA PREGNANCY CARE FELLOWSHIP; AND ESTABLISHING ADDITIONAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTERS THAT RECEIVE STATE FUNDS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

PART I. REDIRECT CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTER FUNDS TO EVIDENCE-BASED MATERNAL AND INFANT HEALTH PROGRAMS

SECTION 1.(a) Section 9H.11 of S.L. 2023-134 is repealed.

SECTION 1.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of six million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$6,250,000) in recurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year and the sum of six million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$6,250,000) in recurring funds for the 2026-2027 fiscal year to be used to support the expansion of evidence-based maternal and infant health programs and services administered by the Department of Health and Human Services.

SECTION 1.(c) This Part becomes effective July 1, 2025.

PART II. REQUIRE THE STATE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF CAROLINA PREGNANCY CARE FELLOWSHIP

SECTION 2. By March 1, 2026, the State Auditor shall conduct a financial statement audit of Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship, a nonprofit corporation. The State Auditor shall report the results of the audit to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services and the Fiscal Research Division.

PART III. ESTABLISH ADDITIONAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTERS THAT RECEIVE STATE FUNDS

SECTION 3.(a) Chapter 131E of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 131E-269.5. Crisis pregnancy centers; reporting requirements.

(a) <u>Definitions. – As used in this section, the following terms have the following</u> meanings:



1 Crisis pregnancy center. – Any nonprofit organization that holds itself out as (1) 2 providing services to pregnant women through pregnancy, birth, and the 3 postpartum period, including a birthing center, clinic, community-based 4 organization, or faith-based organization that holds itself out as providing 5 pregnancy counseling services, pregnancy testing, and other nonmedical 6 pregnancy services. The term does not include a hospital, as defined in 7 G.S. 131E-76, or an ambulatory surgical facility, as defined in G.S. 131E-106. 8 Fiscal year. – The annual operating year of the crisis pregnancy center. <u>(2)</u> 9 State financial assistance. – State funds disbursed to a crisis pregnancy center (3) 10 as a grant, cooperative agreement, noncash contribution, or direct 11 appropriation to a crisis pregnancy center. 12 State funds. – As defined in G.S. 143C-1-1(d)(25). (4) Reporting Requirements. – In addition to the reporting requirements specified in 09 13 14 NCAC 03M .0205, each crisis pregnancy center that is a recipient or subrecipient of any amount 15 of State financial assistance shall submit a report to the Department of Health and Human 16 Services, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services, and the 17 Fiscal Research Division within 60 days after the end of the fiscal year in which the crisis 18 pregnancy center received State financial assistance. The report shall include all of the following 19 information with respect to the fiscal year in which the State financial assistance was received: 20 **(1)** The name of the center and each location where the center conducts business 21 or provides services. 22 <u>(2)</u> The total amount of State funds, federal funds, tax subsidies, or other 23 subsidies, if any, the center received, directly or indirectly, broken down by 24 location if the center conducts business or provides services at more than one 25 location. 26 <u>(3)</u> An explanation of whether the center is part of a larger umbrella organization 27 that operates within the State and, if so, the total amount of State and federal 28 funds or taxes or other subsidies, if any, the umbrella organization received, 29 directly or indirectly, broken down by location if the umbrella organization 30 conducts business or provides services at more than one location. 31 An explanation of all services provided at the center and what services were <u>(4)</u> 32 most frequently sought at the center, broken down by location if the center 33 conducts business or provides services at more than one location. 34 <u>(5)</u> The number of women who accessed services provided at the center during 35 the fiscal year, the geographic regions of the State where these women reside, 36 the distance from the center to the nearest licensed health care facility that 37 provides the same services offered at the center, the price of each service 38 offered at the center, and basic demographic information about each of the 39 women who accessed services provided at the center, including their race, age, 40 and marital status. Basic demographic information included in any report 41 required by this subdivision shall be published in the aggregate without any 42 personal identifying information. 43 (6) An explanation of whether the center holds itself out to the public, either in 44 person, through community participation or events, or through advertising or 45 websites, as a medical facility, health care facility, or other entity that provides 46 comprehensive counseling about all pregnancy options. 47 An explanation of whether women seeking or accessing services at the center <u>(7)</u> 48 are also seeking comprehensive counseling services about pregnancy options 49 or pregnancy services at a licensed health care facility and, if so, whether these 50 women have experienced a delay in receiving health care, including abortion

or the initiation of prenatal care, due to a visit to a center.

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SECTION 3.(b) G.S. 131E-269.5, as enacted by subsection (a) of this section, applies to any crisis pregnancy center that receives State financial assistance on or after July 1, 2025. As used in this section, the terms "crisis pregnancy center" and "State financial assistance" have the same meanings as in G.S. 131E-269.5, as enacted by subsection (a) of this section.

24 PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

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SECTION 4. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law.
